

The Quebec Almanac. [Quebec, 1780-1841]. T.P.L. 707. Gagnon I-96. All volumes have sections in English and in French. Most of the volumes contain information on astronomy, calendars, remarkable events, courts in Quebec, duties and customs, members of the executive and legislative councils, of the Assembly and government departments, lists of notaries, surgeons, pilots, constables, military organizations and religious and educational institutions. William Brown began printing this valuable compendium in 1780 and after his death in 1789 it was continued by the Neilson family until 1841. It did not appear however in 1781, 1783, 1790, 1793 or 1795. The only collection known to contain all the volumes issued, was burned in the Library of Parliament in Montreal, April 25, 1849. Contents generally include: Common notes and calendar - Diameter of the planets - Tide table - Chronological table - Remarkable events of our own times - governor, Legislature, Executive Council, public officers and commissioners - Courts of justice - Justices of the Peace - Advocates - Notaries - Surveyors - Physicians and Surgeons - Trinity House, pilots and rates - Officers of the customs - General post office - Militia, staff and officers - Clergy of the established church - Church of Rome and convents - Church of Scotland - School masters - Public and charitable institutions - Free-mason - Governor and principal officers of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Cape Breton and Newfound-land - Court terms - List of bailiffs -Duties on importations - Roads and stopping Houses, etc. etc.

Kingsmere located in the municiplity of Chelsea, Quebec consisted of the residence of the Speaker of the House of Commons, the Mackenzie King Estate and Kingsmere Lake. Bourinot's inscription is for Christmas and signed Arthur & Nora. ~ Kingsmere was once owned by the author's family, and by prime minister Mackenzie King.





A very rare Canadian regimental history not found in Cooke. The 11 Field Regiment, Royal Canadian Artillery, was mobilized in 1939 in Toronto, Guelph and Hamilton and saw service in Britain, Sicily, Italy and North-West Europe. Battle honours include Salerno, Cassino, and Liri Valley. One of a series of Canadian unit histories privately printed in Holland and Belgium at the end of WWII, generally in small numbers, for the members of each individual unit. Captain Campbell was the Adjutant of the Regiment.







Lowther 1611. Crosby was a member of the Methodist Church and was a lay preacher in Woodstock, Ontario. He answered an appeal for missionaries to work in B.C. and arrived in 1862 and taught in Nanaimo, Chilliwach (first Coqual-eetza School). In 1872 he journeyed through the Interior and in 1874 began work among the Tsimps-hean and along North Pacific coast, using the mission boat "Glad Tidings". By 1897 he was directing the work from Victoria. (Lowther).





In 1870 he was orderly officer to General Wolseley in the Red River Expedition; and in 1884-85 he commanded the Canadian Voyageurs in the Soudan. From 1887 to 1896 he represented West Toronto, as a Conservative, in the Canadian House of Commons. He died at Toronto, on April 15, 1896.





Joseph Guibord was a printer, and member of the Canadian Institute of Montreal who died in Montreal on November 19, 1869. Since the members of the Canadian Institute were at this time under excommunication by the Roman Catholic Bishop, the priest of the Parish of Notre Dame refused Guibord burial in consecrated ground. Guibord's widow, Henriette Brown, brought action in the courts to compel the church to grant her husband burial in the plot belonging to him. The action became a cause celebre, and ran the gamut of the courts until in 1874 the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council found finally in favour of the widow.





"This book was first printed for private circulation probably towards the end of 1816. A small number of copies were printed for limited distribution among Selkirk's friends and others interested in his enterprise. Halkett was Selkirk's brother-in-law and this is his defence of the Red River settlement against the aggressions of the North West Company that lead to the destruction of the colony in the massacre at Seven Oaks in 1816. This work was followed by a reply on behalf of the N.W.Co. 'A Narrative of Occurrences in the Indian Countries' published anonymously. To counter those statements which were considered misrepresentations, a second enlarged edition of Halkett's 'Statement' was prepared and published by John Murray in the same year. Following the Statements p.[1] -125 is an appendix p.[i],-c,[100] containing legal evidence in support of Selkirk's case against the Northwest Co.". Halkett asks if extensive regions in British North America may ever be settled, and if British subjects there are to be denied the protection of British laws.
