On the verso of the photograph is a letter signed by Robert Bell (136 McLaren Street, 4th Nov. '07) to Henry Morgan: Dear Dr. Morgan, This is a Cambridge (England) photo which you said you would like to have with my comp'ts. (Signed) R. Bell. Dr. Henry Morgan (1842-1913) was a prominent Canadian civil servant best remembered for his biographical studies.

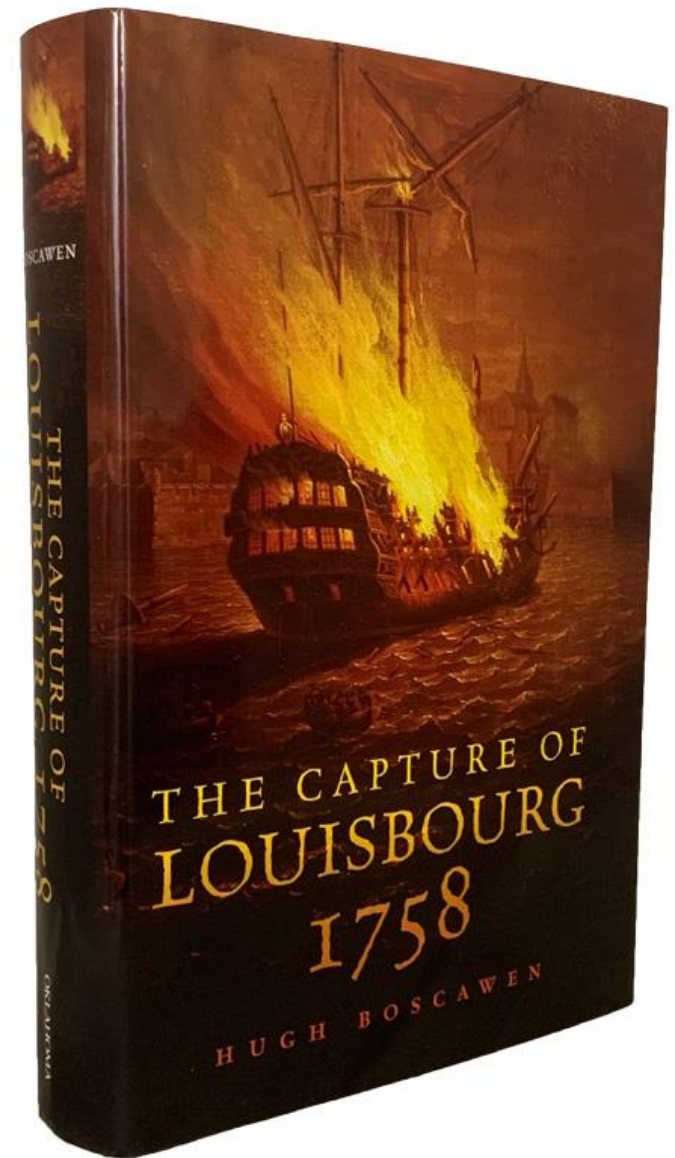

"The City of St. John's presents a very picturesque appearance, being built on the side of a hill with a gradual ascent of about three hundred and fifty feet, overlooking the beautiful harbour, which has the appearance of a lake, after you have passed the narrow entrance. Large hills rise on every side, upon which the fishermen's huts, are scattered here and there, taking from the natural wildnes of the scene. We were hospitably received by the authorities and citizens of St. John's who are very anxious to extend their present limited commercial intercourse with us, and regard the Transatlantic Telegraphic enterprise as a powerful means of bringing about such a result" Harper Monthly, November, 1858. Condition: The window matt was originally laid down on the margin leaving residue; there is a triangular stain on the left side; two faint columnar stains in the sky (probably from original wood backing boards); there is a quarter inch diameter hole on the upper left side; the text window paper containing the titles, is toned. We can recommend an expert restorer.

Our only copy since 1969. The second edition applanation is very lightly the first edition. Christie's Montreal Book Auction had a copy CM-10, 1970. Not other records located.

Lowther 61 "states A glowing description of the early history and development of British Columbia. The author arrived in Victoria in June of 1858 to prospect for gold on the Fraser River. It seems there has been no first edition of the book issued. The folding map must be one of the earliest maps showing the gold fields or where they were

thought to be. Rare. This is the only copy of the book I have ever seen! Prime British Columbia history".

Cornwallis was an English lawyer, historian, editor, novelist and poet who travelled to the Northwest Coast in search of gold. He was particularly impressed by Vancouver Island and British Columbia. "The New El Dorado", published in the same year British Columbia was proclaimed a Crown Colony, is a narrative designed to encourage emigration among the educated classes of Great Britain. Cornwallis felt that British Columbia afforded the highest promise of becoming an important and flourishing colony after the gold rush. Immigration during the rush would serve imperial, social and individual interests. Because of its intent, Cornwallis' book is both intelligent and diverse. It affords a good picture of life in gold-rush British Columbia and underlines the awkward transition from Hudson's Bay Company to Imperial rule occurring as the book was written. The appendix reprints a number of letter and legislative documents including "An Act to Provide for the Government of British Columbia, 2nd August, 1858". - Cuddy & Scott. Peel 457. Lowther 505. In 1871 Fleming was appointed engineer-in-chief to superintend the surveys for the Canadian Pacific Railway. He surveyed the route through the Yellowhead Pass which is now followed by the Canadian National Railway; and he was the first to demonstrate the practicability of the route through the Kicking Horse, Eagle and Rogers passes.

Thomas Pichon (1700-1781) was born in France and came to Louisbourg with Comte de Raymond, Governor of Cape Breton, as his secretary in 1751 and was posted to Fort Beauséjour in Nova Scotia as a civilian official in the 1750s, but entered into negotiations with the commandant of Fort Lawrence, the rival British stronghold, and acted as a British spy in the French fort. Even after the capitulation when he was taken to Halifax, ostensibly as a prisoner, he continued to spy on French prisoners in that town, sending his information to British officials. Naturally unable to return to France, Pichon settled in London in 1756 under a new name and received a pension from the British government. Although he spoke very little English, he passed his time happily enough in an illicit affair with a French authoress living in London, Madame de Beaumont, and in composing this history of Cape Breton.





The book is composed as a series of letters on a wide variety of subjects, is detailed, well-written, and reliable. Written from Louisbourg from 1752, to its fall to the English in 1758, it is considered a reliable source concerning the French in Acadia during the 18th century, including clear descriptions of Ile Royal, Ile Saint Jean, Micmac and Malecite Indians, the French government at Louisbourg, military events and the causes of the war.

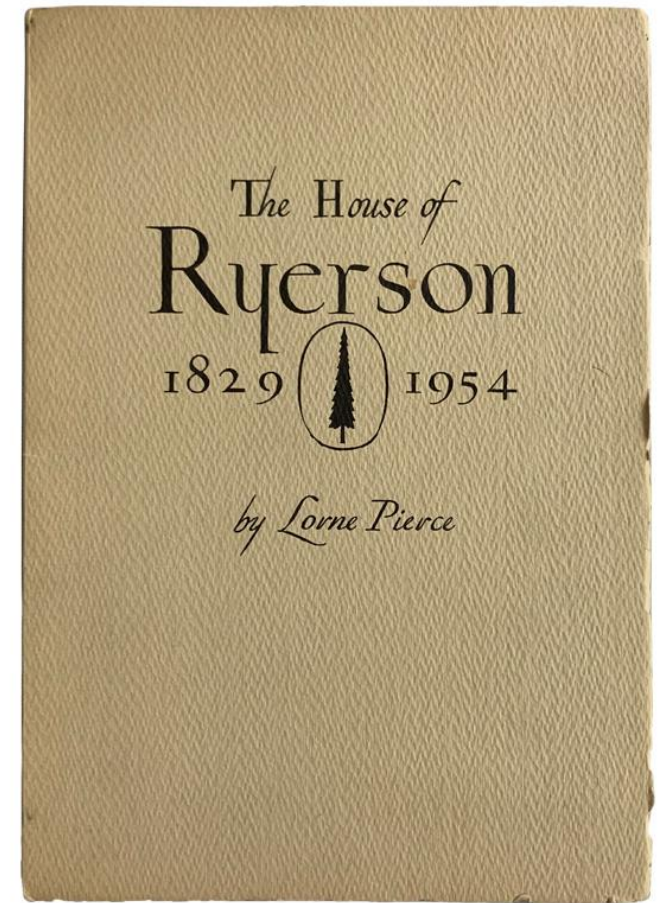

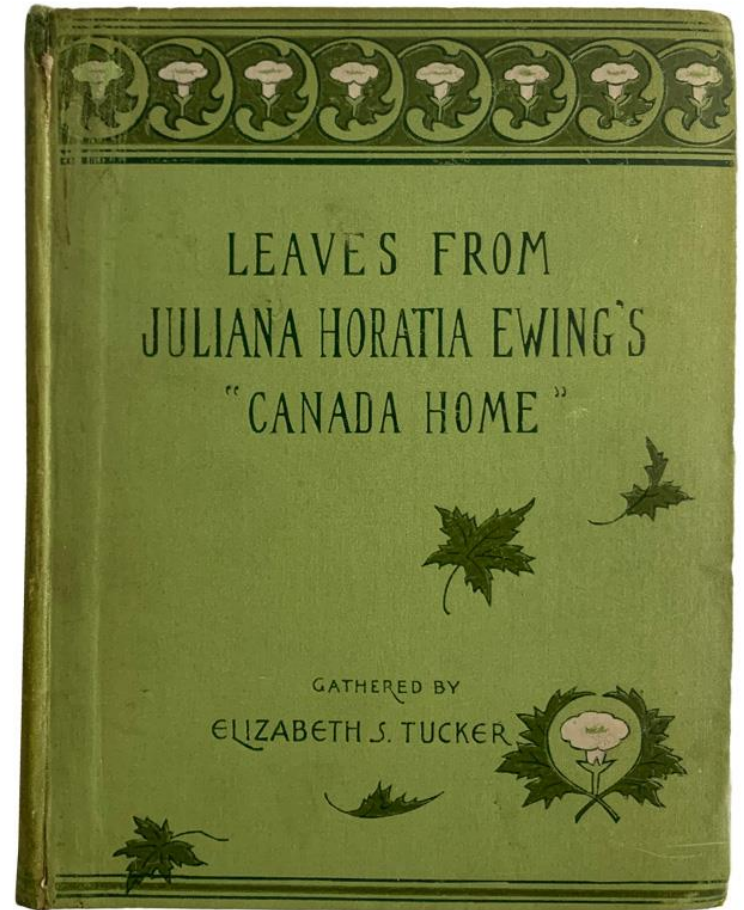
Thomas Jefferson Sutherland, an American solicitor and journalist in Buffalo, he joined William Lyon Mackenzie on Navy Island in December 1837 and became second-in-command of the 'patriot' army. Sent to the Detroit frontier, he led a force to Bois Blanc Island on 9 Jan. 1838, was captured, tried by court martial, sentenced to the penal colony in Van Dieman's Land, and sent to Quebec to wait for transportation. While there he employed his considerable skill in prose and verse by writing loose leaves from the portfolio of a late patriot prisoner in Canada, which he published in New York in 1839 following his release in August 1838 on the grounds that his trails and sentence had been unconstitutional. He followed this work with three political letters addressed to Dr. Wolfred Nelson (New York. 1840); A Letter to Her Majesty....; and A letter to Lord Brougham, on behalf of the captive patriots (New York, 1841). - Story p784. very good.

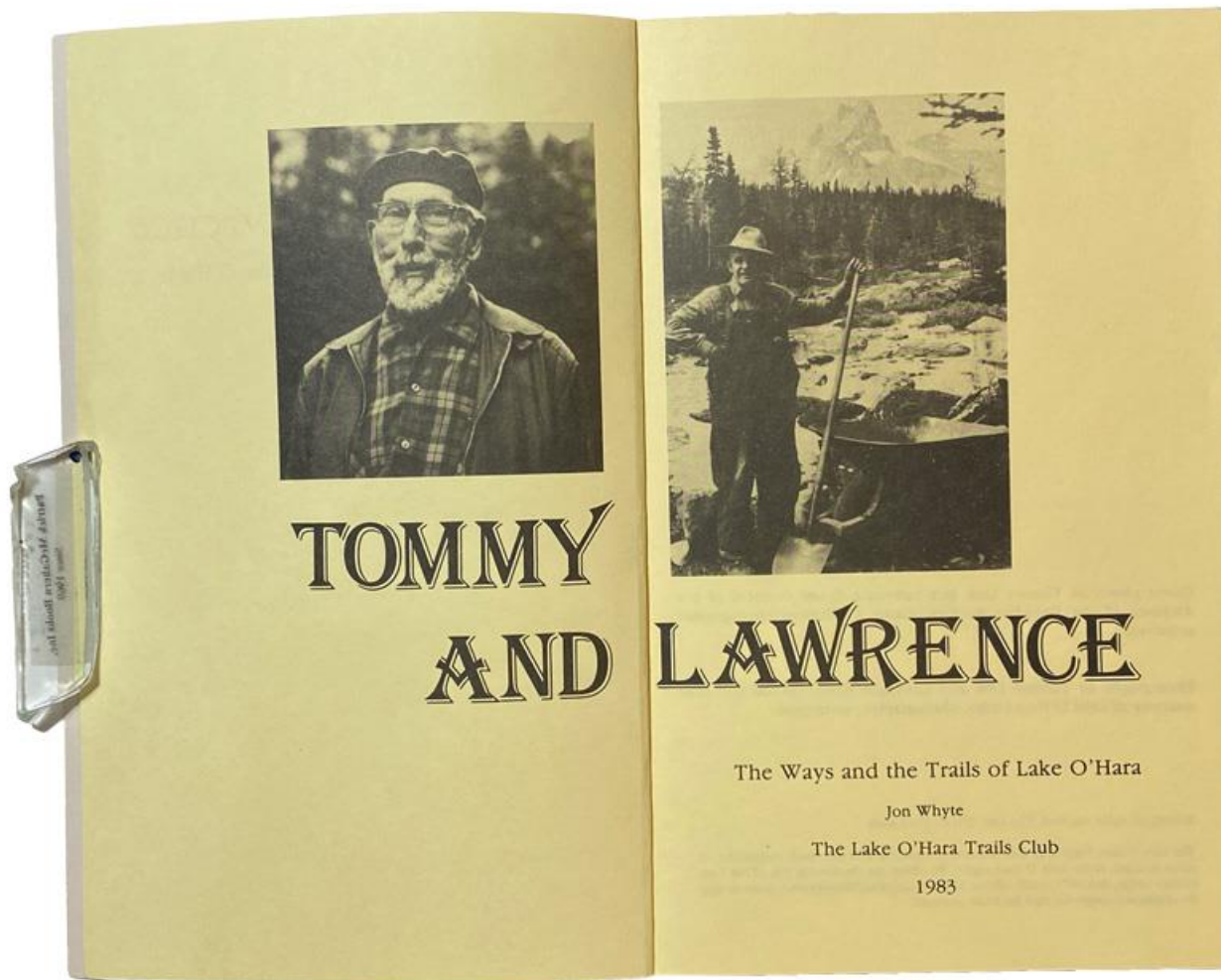

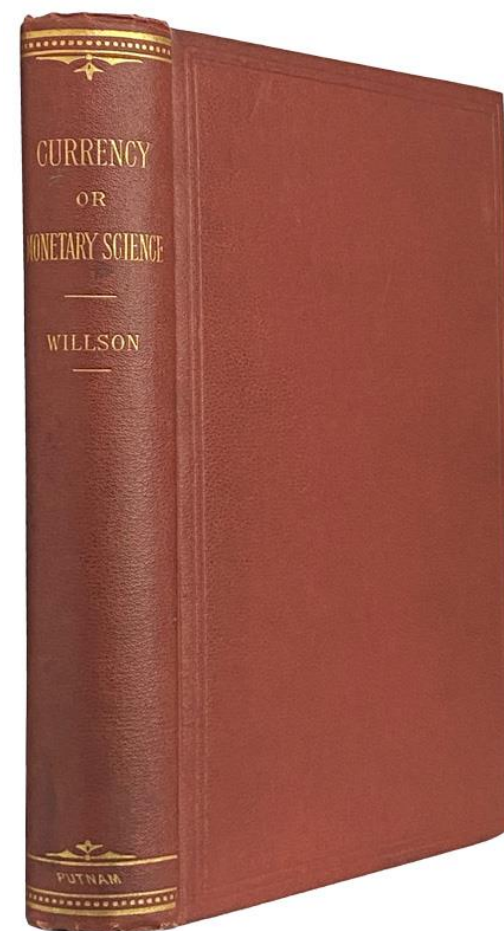

WILLSON, HUGH BOWLBY (Bowlsby, Boultyby), (At the core of Canadian economic thought) - barrister, author, journalist, and businessman; b. in Saltfleet Township, U.C., 15 Sept. 1813, third son of John Willson\* and Elizabeth Bowlby, and uncle of Thomas Leopold "Carbide" Willson\*; d. in New York City, 29 April 1880. ... **2,200.00**

Willson moved to Washington, D.C., around the close of the Civil War and married Harriot Conway Ladde of that city. He later settled in New York City but continued to follow Canadian affairs and to write for the Hamilton Spectator. He had sophisticated and advanced ideas on monetary theory, and was a persistent advocate of reform of the money and banking system in both the United States and Great Britain. He became deeply involved in the postwar "Greenback" controversy in the United States. In a number of pamphlets and in testimony before a congressional committee in 1879, he argued strongly that notes issued by the state should be the permanent and exclusive circulating medium. He suggested the creation of a currency board to control the issue of paper money and proposed that the amount of paper money should be related to the volume of business transactions in the country. He believed that monetary mismanagement was a principal cause of periodic depressions in Great Britain and the United States. He was also a vigorous opponent of the Bank of England and wanted the introduction of one pound notes for general circulation "of a convenient size for pocket use."...

The quality of Willson's writings on money and banking was excellent and he foreshadowed a number of welcome changes which were to be introduced after his death. He kept in touch with his friend and mentor John Rae until Rae's death in 1871, and, although he does not specifically refer to Rae in his writings, he was clearly influenced by his penetrating ideas on economics. He died in New York in 1880, survived by his wife and two adopted children. DCB. R. Warren James and John S. Moir. fine. Item #44095

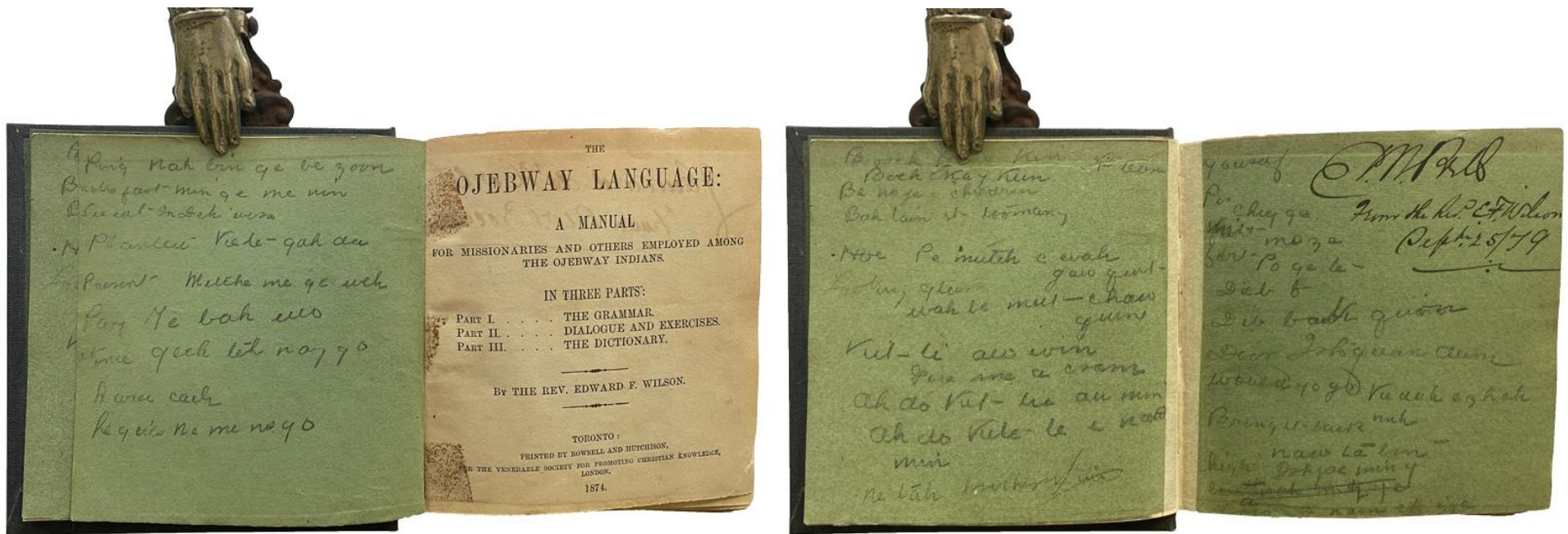
