With a foreword by George F.G. Stanley. A bibliography of Canadiana; of nearly six hundred rare books and imprints spanning the seventeenth through nineteenth centuries. Works by Lescarbot, Champlain, Vancouver, Franklin and Palliser are indicative of the early accounts of Canadian exploration and settlement. There are personal testimonies of battles, ethnographies of native peoples, early histories of the country and scientific and religious treatises. Imprints by such eighteenth-century printers as Fleury Mesplet and John and Samuel Neilson are represented.





# Court of General Sessions

April, 1870.

ORDERED: That any person who shall by insulting or abusive language or behaviour, taunting epithets, or threatening gesture, attempt to provoke another person to commit a breach of the peace in any public street, thoroughfare, alley, road or by-road, or on any building, or whereby a breach of the peace may be occasioned shall be liable to be fined on a sum not exceeding eight dollars, together with the costs of conviction, to be recovered before a Justice of the peace on the oath of a credible witness. And that the fine or penalty when collected shall be paid by the Justice collecting the same to some one of the commissioners or overseers of the poor or alms house for the Parish in Which the offence may have been committed for the support of the poor thereof, and if such fine or penalty together with the cosis be not forthwith paid, the said Justice shall and may commit the offender to jail, there to remain one day for every fifty cents of the said fine or penalty and costs unless the same be sooner paid. And that the orders passed September sessions, 1862, Record Book D, page 446, and at September sessions, 1863, page 463 of records be hereby repealed.



Inkerman, located in the united counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, 22km northwest of Morrisburg, this community was first known as Smith's Mills and then as Bishop's Mills. It was named in 1858 after the battle of Inkerman in the Crimea, fought on 5 November 1854. (Rayburn).

John Small (1746-1831).. came to Canada in 1792 and in 1793 he was appointed clerk of the Executive Council of Upper Canada. This position he held at York, until his death in 1831. cf. D.C.B.

"... Small is best known for the duel on 3 Jan. 1800 in which he mortally wounded John White\*, the attorney general. Mrs Small had publicly snubbed the notoriously quarrelsome Mrs White. White reacted by questioning the legality of Small's marriage and the morals of his wife in a letter to David William Smith\*, which was communicated to Chief Justice John Elmsley\* and received credence in York society. Small insisted upon immediate

satisfaction, without determining how much of the gossip had actually come from White. He was acquitted on a charge of murder after a brief trial, despite the hostility of the presiding judge, Henry Allcock\*.

The affair ruined both Mrs Small's reputation and the connection that Small had formed with the Russells, Macaulays, and Macdonells of Collachie. Peter Russell\*, who at Newark in May 1795 had defended Small against an anonymous libel, was White's friend and executor. When Small sought election to the House of Assembly in July 1800 he was defeated; and in a second attempt at a by-election a year later he was crushed, 112 votes to 32, by Angus Macdonell\* (Collachie). Of his former friends, Joseph Willcocks\* and the elder Robert Baldwin voted for him. On New Year's Day 1806 Elizabeth Russell would still acknowledge him only by "a distant curtsey." Two years later, Mrs Small's invitation to a governor's levee occasioned resentment.

As clerk of the council, Small was paid £100 a year – less than an unskilled labourer and only slightly more than the senior of his two clerks – besides being entitled to about one-fifteenth of land fees. He had inherited property in Gloucestershire which he disposed of some time before the end of 1795. Forbidden in 1797 to collect fees from loyalists and unsuccessful in petitions for a higher stipend, he was able to establish his family by speculating in land at York. One of the first officials to buy a house there, in August 1795, he had accumulated over 2,500 acres before beginning to sell lots in 1797 and he continued to acquire and sell land. By the 1820s the rise in York land prices had made him prosperous.


He also regained a position in York society. An active churchman (his brother was prebendary of Gloucester Cathedral), he was a trustee of the York District grammar school by 1811 and soon after found a patron in John Strachan\* Small even achieved some political influence under Administrator Samuel Smith, to whom Strachan thought him "a considerable Adviser." He launched one son, James Edward\*, on a successful career as a lawyer and reform politician; the youngest, Charles Coxwell, succeeded him in the clerkship of the crown and pleas as well as in his militia commission. His house at York, handsomely rebuilt by Charles Coxwell, stood until 1925."." D.C.B. VI- by S. R. Mealing..






EST C T 26008; Each play has separate title page. List of subscribers included. ~ Colley Cibber was born in London and after a checkered academic education, took to the stage as an actor. While he gained some success in comic roles, he was ridiculed as a tragedian. Nevertheless, his calling was in all aspects of theatrical life, from performance to staging and managing. After acting at Drury Lane for ?ve years, Cibber wrote Love's Last Shift'. It was a great success, and he continued writing and performing. In 1710, Cibber bought the Drury Lane company with two other partners, He continued to appear on stag in his own plays, as well as in adaptations of Shakespeare's works. He was appointed Poet Laureate in 1730 over Alexander Pope, although his poetic abilities were far from being comparable. Pope, in turn, made Cibber the mock-hero of his Dunciad, giving him the title King of the Dunces. An interesting collection of plays from one of 18th century London's most visible characters.

Over the next 30 years Harmon became a leading citizen of Banff, founding the local Board of Trade, the Rotary Club, and serving in municipal government. His



Georg Wilhelm Steller was born in Germany and educated at Wittenberg as a physician, he accompanied wounded troops to their Russian homeland in I 734 and there



met the naturalist and geographer Daniel Gottlieb Messerschmidt (1685-1735). Messerschmidt had been contracted by Russian Emperor Peter the Great to gather medicinal plants and other floral species in Siberia. Over a seven-year excursion, he collected many rare specimens, including the first mammoth fossil remains, and kept a detailed diary of his bindings. When Messerschmidt died and Steller married his widow, Steller had access to these notes, piquing his interest in exploration. He had the opportunity to join Vitus Bering's second expedition to Kamchatka in 1740, as a scientist and physician. He spent the winter in Kamchatka, and then Bering asked him to accompany him to further investigate the strait between the islands. After the ship went of course in a storm and landed at Kayak Island, Alaska in 1741, Steller explored the terrrain, thus being the first European on Alaskan soil.



This work contains his detailed observations of Kamchatka and the Alaskan coast in the 18th century: the geography of the land, including the minerals and fossils; the marine birds and animals, and the insects, flora and fauna, many of which were new to him. He also discusses the native Itelmen and their social life, customs and dress; as well as their means of settling disputes, and the possibilities for future trade with them. Baron Joseph von Lassberg (1770-1855) was in the service of Prince von Furstenberg as chief warden of forests before retiring to his estate at Eppishausen. He collected more than 12,000 books and 273 valuable manuscripts for his library, which he eventually sold to the Fiirstlich Fiirtenbergischen Hofbibliothek at Donaueschingen, Germany.



Published anonymously, the work deals with the economy and commercial policies of both countries, and looks at colonization as a factor of governmental policy. The author, after a turbulent youth in England, spent a large portion of his life directing colonial affairs, specifically in Australia, New Zealand and Canada. He accompanied Lord Durham to North America in 1838, and had a large share in drawing up Durham's famous Report on the affairs of British North America. He was also involved in the National Colonization Society in Australia, and directed the New Zealand Company in London.

Yworth was a master distiller and "chemical physician" from Rotterdam who moved to England. In addition to producing medicines (pills, menstruums, and tonics), he pioneered the manufacture of "artificial" wines, i.e. liquor distilled from malted corn, cider, or perry. Yworth was also corresponded with Isaac Newton concerning alchemical matters (see below.) "William Yworth (d. 1715), distiller and chemical physician, claimed to have been born in 'Shipham', in the Netherlands (this location has not been traced). His early life and education are obscure, but by 1690 he was practicing as a chemical physician from his house at the sign of the Collegium Chymicum in Rotterdam. He later suggested that he had begun his studies in chemistry and philosophy about 1680. By June 1691 he had moved to England, attracted by the relatively low levels of duty payable on liquor distilled from malted corn, cider, or perry, established by statute to encourage native alternatives to

French wines, whose importation had been prohibited in 1689. He resided at the Academia Spagyrica Nova, at the Blue Ball and Star, in the London suburb of Shadwell, from where he sold medicines, wrote works on distillation, and offered lessons in chemical philosophy and practice. His earliest publications, composed while he was still resident in the Netherlands and published in 1690, discussed distillation at length, as well as exhorting English manufacturers to exploit native resources, especially metallic ores. It was Yworth's intention, in writing the "Whole art of Distillation", to bring together his vast working knowledge of distillation processes in order to provide both the most complete and clearest dissertation on the subject and a clear and practical manual for performing distillation processes (those of his predecessors, notable Baker, being full of errors and, where correct, too confusing or vague to follow.) The "Whole Art" contains recipes for many pills and medicinal tonics, which Yworth marketed through a network of small salesmen across London, sealing them with his own device to protect against imitations. "In 1709 Yworth applied for a license to practice as a physician from Woodbridge, Suffolk, where it appears he and his family had been living for some while. He kept a shop there, achieving moderate prosperity, and continued to operate as both a distiller and a chemical physician. Shortage of money, however, prevented him from pursuing the most elaborate of his schemes, which involved publishing a succession of his alchemical and medical treatises. He died in 1715."(ODNB) Isaac Newton and William Yworth: A Collaboration between Two Alchemists Yworth was also the author of an alchemical tract known



as the 'Processus mysterii magni philosophicus', two versions of which (apparently in Yworth's hand) were found among Newton's own alchemical manuscripts. There are also extant two letters written by Yworth to Newton that indicate a working relationship between the two men. There are also manuscripts in Newton's hand that show he was involved in the further editing of the 'Processus'. Karin Figala and Ulrich Petzold give an analysis of Newton's reworking of the text in their "Alchemy in the Newtonian Circle", in Renaissance and Revolution (1993), p. 187-190).
