


In 1893 Lord Aberdeen became Governor General of Canada and he and Lady Aberdeen traveled extensively in Canada. Her journal is an important source of insight into the problems and times in the country during the 1890's. The appendix contains a biographical dictionary of principal persons and lists the members of the household.

Far more important, however, was her work with women's organizations. A staunch Presbyterian and Gladstonian Liberal, a woman of great poise and boundless energy, she was an aristocrat-democrat with a strong social conscience. She believed that women represented an enormous, unused capacity in Canada, and that they would be a civilizing force in an untamed country. She was instrumental in forming the Canadian branch of the National Council of Women. Despite fierce opposition from the medical establishment, she created the Victorian Order of Nurses. The social family compact in Ottawa, Montréal and Toronto opposed and ridiculed her projects. Her attempts to use Rideau Hall to cool the racial and religious passions of the 1890s and to break down social barriers did not endear her to the local establishment. -John Saywell "Encyc Can",






Written by William Shirley and William Mildmay who were the English commissioners appointed after the Treaty of Aix-La-Chapelle of 1748 to negotiate the dispute with France over the boundaries of Acadie. The work was designed to counter the French memorials and to respond specifically to a certain pamphlet written by Mathieu Francois Pidansat de Marobert, 'Discussion Sommaire'.


Sir Arthur George (1860-1936), archivist and historian. In 1904, he was appointed Dominion archivist, and he discharged the duties of this office with great distinction until his retirement in 1935. (DCB). He was also a book collector and had many of his own books produced in limited editions including small number special bound issues within the limitation. (ie., copies 1 to 10 are....) elaborate fine bindings. My sense of this particular book is that it was a proof copy produced without the colour plates, known in the trade as a






proofer's dummy which was to give the author and publisher a sense of the book's design. Doughty would certainly have seen such a copy as important and would have wanted it bound as it is now. This assumption is based on pleasant book call visits to Mrs. Doughty's home on Creighton Street in the early nineteen seventies where many of these editions and issues were part of their book collection. Sometimes these books were given as presentation copies to friends or were reserved for family, none were sold. The present copy has the attractive bibliophilic designed book-plate of "John R. Woods".






"This book was first printed for private circulation probably towards the end of 1816. A small number of copies were printed for limited distribution among Selkirk's friends and others interested in his enterprise. Halkett was Selkirk's brother-in-law and this is his defence of the Red River settlement against the aggressions of the North West Company that lead to the destruction of the colony in the massacre at Seven Oaks in 1816. This work was followed by


a reply on behalf of the N.W.Co. `A Narrative of Occurrences in the Indian Countries' published anonymously. To counter those statements which were considered misrepresentations, a second enlarged edition of Halkett's `Statement' was prepared and published by John Murray in the same year. Following the Statements p.[1] -125 is an appendix p.[i],-c,[100] containing legal evidence in support of Selkirk's case against the Northwest Co.". Halkett asks if extensive regions in British North America may ever be settled, and if British subjects there are to be denied the protection of British laws.

R[obert] A[unchmuty] Sproule, a miniature painter and illustrator, came to Canada from Ireland in the late 1820's. Much of his work was published by Adolphus Bourne, as were the lithographed illustrations in this work, which were from drawings by A.J. Russell, W.S. Sewell, and Capt. Alderson. Views include, Quebec from Beauport - Castle St. Lewis - Hope Gate - Dalhousie-Gate - Officers Barracks - St. John Gate - Palace-Gate - Parliament House - Marine Hospital - Quebec Harbour. Early in the history of lithography in Canada, the first lithographs were executed in 1824.



The Toronto Lithographic Company printed three large coloured lithographs of the major events that took place during the Louis Riel Rebellion. Each print had 17,18 &28 numbered key below the image which shows positions of the opposing forces, including the Royal Grenadiers, topographical features & gun emplacements. They were created within weeks of the actual fighting and depict the battles with surprising accuracy. They were each based upon designs by F. W. Curzon, who was a special war artist for "The Illustrated London News". He travelled with General Middleton's forces from the beginning of the Rebellion to the end. Their chief illustrator - and one of Canada's leading artists of the time, W.D. Blatchly, (1836-1903) was given the task of doing the paintings. He used the



battlefield sketches of Curzon and military men who were skilled artists, and had been at the battle sites, Capt. Rutherford, Lt. Wadmore and Sgt. Gundy, as the basis of these large panoramic paintings. He integrated the highlights of each battle into one view. Each original lithograph is printed on 19th century wove paper with full margins as published in Toronto in 1885. Each has clear vibrant colour.


The North-West Rebellion (or North-West Resistance) was a violent, five-month insurgency against the Canadian government, fought mainly by Métis militants and their Aboriginal allies in what is now Saskatchewan and Alberta. It was caused by rising fear and insecurity among the Métis and Aboriginal peoples as well as the white settlers of the rapidly changing West. A series of battles and other outbreaks of violence in 1885 left hundreds of people dead, but the rebels were eventually defeated by federal troops. The result was the permanent enforcement of Canadian law in the West, the subjugation of the Métis and the Plains tribes, and the conviction and hanging of rebel leader Louis Riel.
